Sisters of St. Joseph of the Sacred Heart (St. Mary MacKillop of the Cross)

We are affectionately known as the Josephites or the 'Joeys', and today Sisters of St Joseph live in communities ministering throughout Australia, New Zealand, Ireland, Peru, East Timor, Scotland and Brazil.

We were founded in **Penola**, South Australia in 1866 by an Australian woman Mary MacKillop, and an English priest **Reverend Julian E Tenison Woods**.

From the beginning we have lived among people, sharing daily life and responding to the needs of the day. Held in God's hospitable heart we draw strength to respond to places of violence, fear and insecurity in our world, the places of incompleteness and limitation in ourselves.

As we walk as one with people and with trust in God's Providence we listen again and again for the cry of the poor and respond revealing the hospitable heart of our God. (Ref. 25th General Chapter).

The Centre of the Congregation is the Motherhouse at **Mary MacKillop Place**, Mount Street North Sydney where Mary MacKillop's tomb is enshrined in the **Mary MacKillop Memorial Chapel**.

Somascan Fathers

The original group around the person of St Jerome Emiliani was called “Servants of the Poor”. It was later recognized by the Church as the Order of the Clerics Regular of Somasca (CRS), or more simply Somascan Fathers, with reference to a little village in North Italy, where the founder died and was buried.

They were born at a time when the Catholic Church was in great need of renewal. They sought to renew themselves, and thus offered their contribution to renewing the whole Church.

The Somascan Fathers are a relatively small congregation but they are present in all continents. It comprises priests lay men in small Gospel communities engaged in the human and Christian development of young people and service to the poor.

They are present in WA with one community serving two parishes: Spearwood and Rockingham.

Tinol

It is pronounced as CHINOL, gaelic for “gathering”. Years ago five ladies whose husbands had predeceased them met to discuss the possibility of forming a group for Catholic ladies in similar circumstances in order to support each other and overcome grief. It was decided to commence a monthly meeting on a social basis for fellowship and outings. It is a women-only group. They meet on the 3rd Thursday of the month.

Guiding Principles

Individual Care and Approach

Human beings are ready to respond to a personal loving touch. The members of our community are caring and generous, and respond best when they are approached individually and feel they are wanted and valued – not just one in the crowd. This fact obviously poses a challenge to the priests, as the community is large and priests are only two. Many community members are active in helping to reach out. The best would be that everyone takes it upon oneself to do this, not on behalf of oneself, but of the parish.

Servant Spirituality:

Our parish was entrusted to the care of the religious order of the Somascan Fathers. St. Jerome Emiliani their founder, who lived at the beginning of the 16th century, had chosen this word to express his and his companions' identity: Servant of the poor. The "washing of the feet" is supposed to inspire every breath of a Somascan religious, especially when he is entrusted with authority. A servant is expected to work, not to be served. This way of life is offered to all who wish to share their spirit.

Truth and Love

Truth without charity is fundamentalism, charity without truth is sentimentalism, Pope Benedict expressed in his encyclical letter "Charity in Truth". We know we cannot deprive our community members of any of these two essential human needs. It would be injustice to do so. Keeping this balance is a constant strive and a continuous challenge.
